As we begin this new term of office, I would first of all like to thank you all for turning out in such large numbers to vote in the local elections on 15th March... And for having overwhelmingly cast your votes for the 'Unis pour Eymet' list, awarding it 20 out of 23 seats.

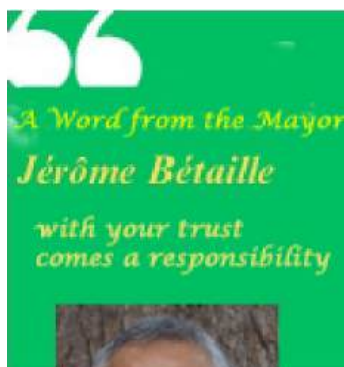
Throughout my terms of office, I have chosen to be a mayor who represents our community at other levels too. As a departmental councilor, I am also involved in water management for 44,000 customers and I chair the Portes Sud Périgord community of communes. My aim is to develop a broader perspective on rural issues and secure greater resources to defend our town, whilst always remaining attentive, approachable and available to you, the residents of Eymet.

I have heard your concerns regarding roads, pavements, household waste, and so on. I know I don't do everything perfectly, but I try to do my best with the resources at our disposal. On the financial front, our budgets have always been balanced – a management approach that requires a gradual, measured approach to our investment decisions. As has been the case in previous terms of office, there will be no additional tax without a clearly defined investment project.

The municipal team has been at work since 20th March. Re-elected councilors are continuing their work on ongoing issues, whilst new councilors are familiarising themselves with the realities on the ground in order to implement future projects. We are maintaining the same operating structure as during the previous term of office, with six teams of deputy mayors and councilors sharing responsibility for the following areas: town management, quality of life, social affairs, sports, mediation/citizenship, and cultural affairs. The organisational chart, representatives to trade unions and other external bodies, municipal committees and office hours can be found on the following pages.

You have elected me for a fourth term, and I am honoured by your trust. Nothing can be taken for granted, but with my new team, we will continue to work to ensure a high quality of life in Eymet, to enhance its appeal and to strengthen its place within a recognised local community.

PROVISIONAL BUDGET 2026

Every year, the municipal council votes on the budget, which is essential to the smooth running of local life. It sets out the roadmap for the local authority's activities whilst adhering to a strict financial framework. On 20th April 2026, the municipal council adopted the main budget and the supplementary budgets (nursery, rural holiday village, sewerage, abattoir) for the municipality.

Despite an increasingly challenging financial climate for local authorities, the budget has been drawn up to enable essential investment projects to go ahead whilst keeping operating expenditure under control and without raising tax rates. It is balanced in terms of both revenue and expenditure at €6,829,546 and breaks down as follows:



Operating expenditure has been budgeted at €3,643,771 (including a transfer of €1,605,631 to the investment section). These are financed mainly by revenue from local taxes (33.97 per cent), the carried-over operating surplus (30.28 per cent) and central government grants (29.28 per cent). A total of €3,185,775 has been budgeted for capital expenditure.

Gross savings, also known as 'self-financing capacity', amount to €1,605,631. This sum will enable, on the one hand, the repayment of debt and, on the other, the implementation of the investment programme for 2026, including the resurfacing of Rue de la Sole, the purchase of the Post Office building, the continuation of works at Plaine de Bretou, at the abattoir and on the wastewater collection network, landscaping around the war memorial in the future Garden of Remembrance, at the crèche, and at the Bretou holiday village; the modernisation of street lighting; the completion of the study on the Chateau; and the implementation of the circular economy project.



REVIEW OF SOME OF THE NOTABLE EVENTS AT THE BEGINNING OF 2026

On Friday 9th January, the mayor delivered the municipality's New Year's greetings to the many residents in attendance at La Gare flanked by outgoing elected officials. As the event took place during the pre-election period, there was no review of the past year's achievements; instead, the ceremony focused on the major events that had marked the previous year and was characterised by a sense of restraint and camaraderie.



The next day, Saturday 10th January, firefighters from the Eymet fire station celebrated la Sainte-Barbe's Day. Eymet firefighters were presented with their stripes, certificates, and medals in recognition of their dedication. Pascal Buggin was honored for his 40 years of service at the Eymet Fire Station, which earned him the rank of adjutant and the Firefighters' Medal of Honor, Grand Gold class.



COMMEMORATIONS AT THE WAR MEMORIAL



The Ceremonies on 19th March - National Day of Remembrance and Reflection in memory of the civilian and military victims of the Algerian War and the fighting in Tunisia and Morocco, and 8th May, the 81st anniversary of the victory on 8th May 1945, took place in front of the War Memorial, in the Garden of Remembrance currently under construction around Gabriel Forestier's sculpture

The sun was out to welcome a slightly larger crowd than in previous years.



NATIONAL FLAME CEREMONY

This ceremony was organised in partnership with the Association of Reserve Officers of the Haute-Savoie Gendarmerie. As part of this initiative, 30 Gendarmerie cadets, accompanied by their officers, both active-duty and reserve gendarmes from Haute-Savoie, traveled to Paris to collect the flame from the Arc de Triomphe and pass it on to 12 of their volunteer officers, volunteers, who set off on a relay bike ride across France to Lourdes as part of the "Challenge for the Wounded," where they joined other participants in the Challenge for the Wounded from all over France.

Over five days, from 17th to 23rd May, they rode in a relay through 105 towns—including Eymet on Wednesday 20th May, to meet with young people in the villages. In Eymet, middle school students read several passages in memory of those who fought or served for France, before lighting a candle from the flame of the Unknown Soldier and placing it at the foot of the war memorial, in memory of the soldiers who fell in battle.



ADDRESSING OF RUELLES & CARRYROUS

A survey has been underway since May to identify the main entrances to homes facing the narrow streets in the bastide. Letters have been placed in the mailboxes of homes that straddle the following streets: Rue de l'Amadou, Rue du Tibre, Rue du Couvent, Rue du Loup, Rue du Temple, and Rue Portanel. Residents are invited to contact the Mairie on Tuesdays and Fridays, and on Wednesdays from 1:30 p.m. to 5:00 p.m., or by phone at 05.53.22.22.10 to discuss their needs and facilitate the implementation of street addressing in the ruelles & carryrous.



ANIMAL IDENTIFICATION & PREVENTION OF STRAY ANIMALS

Following the campaign carried out in the Bastide in September 2024, a new spay-and-neuter campaign is currently underway in partnership with the Pawprint Association, Dr. Crochelet's veterinary practice, and with financial support from the 30 Millions d'Amis Foundation.

After being caught by volunteers from the organisation, the cats are taken to the veterinarian, who spays or neuters them and tags them; they are then returned to where they were captured by the same volunteers. Each spayed or neutered cat is thus healthier and safer, which helps reduce the spread of disease and prevents the birth of thousands of new kittens.

Unidentified stray dogs are regularly spotted on public property. We would like to remind you that allowing pets to roam freely is prohibited and that identification is required.

If you love your pet, get it micro chipped and spayed or neutered! Loving your pet also means keeping it on a leash during walks and picking up excrement after it.

ARCHEOLOGICAL DIG AT BLIS

The second phase of the three-year archaeological excavation program at the Blis site took place earlier than in previous years. In fact, the excavation team led by Juliette and Quentin, archaeologists from the University of Bordeaux, was hard at work as early as mid-May in an effort to uncover new artifacts. This new campaign, disrupted by a heat wave that lasted several days, led to the discovery of new traces of our Gallic ancestors! The archaeologists organized an open house at the excavation site on 13th June a summary of this fourth excavation campaign undertaken at the site will be featured in the next Municipal Newsletter.



THE POST OFFICE OPENING HOURS SUMMER 2026

From 29th June to 29th August 2026, the Eymet Post Office will be open Monday to Friday from 9:15 a.m. to 12:15 p.m., and on Saturdays (even-numbered weeks only) from 9:15 a.m. to 12:00 p.m. The office will resume its regular hours starting on 31st August.

PEDESTRIANISED SQUARE

As is the case every year from May through to the end of September, Place Gambetta is reserved for pedestrians from 6 p.m. to midnight Monday to Saturday, and starting at noon on Sundays. Traffic and parking are also prohibited there when special events are taking place. This prohibition applies to both cars and motorcycles.

CONTROL OF NOISE

A prefectural ordinance regulates noise levels to prevent disturbances to public order. DIY and gardening work involving the use of petrol powered equipment is permitted only during the following hours: on weekdays from 8:30 a.m. to 12:00 p.m. and from 2:00 p.m. to 7:30 p.m., on Saturdays from 9:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m. and from 3:00 p.m. to 7:00 p.m., and on Sundays and bank holidays from 10:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m.

FIRE PREVENTION

9 out of 10 wildfires are caused by human activity and could be prevented by following these simple precautions:

- Dispose of your cigarette butts in an ashtray. Smoking is prohibited in the forest.
- Set your barbecues in a designated area away from any vegetation (grass, brush, etc.) and never in the forest.
- Do DIY projects away from sensitive areas to protect them from sparks, and keep a fire extinguisher or bucket of water within reach.
- Protect your home by clearing brush from your property and around your house before the summer season, and clean roofs and gutters of all plant debris.
- Keep any stored firewood or gas cylinders away from your home and store them in a locked shed.

The risk of a fire breaking out is even greater during periods of drought. When vegetation is dried out due to a lack of rain, a fire can start and spread quickly. In the event of a fire, call 18 or 112.

HEATWAVE PLAN



Vulnerable or isolated residents living at home are encouraged to register on the "vulnerable individuals" registry at the Mairie. This will allow them to receive special attention in the event of a heat wave.

WAR MEMORIAL

Amid the rain and frost earlier this year, the initial landscaping work on the Garden of Remembrance surrounding the War Memorial was completed in time for the 19th March commemorations. A wide path leads to a small area at the far end of the site, where the commemorative stone by Eymet based sculptor Gabriel Forestier stands majestically. Landscaping is currently underway in the surrounding area, and trees have been planted to replace the ones that had to be removed.

New mounts for the commemorative plaques are being considered. A local artisan from Eymet, Bruno Grossoleil, has proposed a collaborative project with the MFR in Bourgounague to restore the perimeter wall of this site.

A writing project is scheduled for early 2027 with middle school students on the theme of the war as experienced by the residents of Eymet. Once completed, the texts, displayed on panels, will form part of the memorial trail.

VACANT HOUSING UNITS

A survey of vacant housing units is currently being conducted throughout the municipality to gain a better understanding of the local housing stock and to inform future housing planning. To date, more than 100 buildings have been identified.

In addition, please note that for all renovation and facade restoration work, it is necessary to submit a planning application.

SANITATION

In early February, AGUR collected more than 100 kilograms of waste (wipes, floor cloths, diapers) from the sewer system, which causes malfunctions. **We would remind you that baby wipes and feminine hygiene products must be disposed of in the black household waste bag.**



ROAD MAINTENANCE

An assessment of the municipal road network was conducted, focusing on horizontal and vertical signage: road markings, traffic signs, and related equipment. This assessment will help identify maintenance, replacement, or compliance needs.

Furthermore, following the damage caused by the February 2026 storms to the Quai de la Navigation parking area, the work carried out in June is primarily aimed at securing the parking area through limited but necessary measures, pending a more comprehensive review of the development of this zone.



EARLY CHILDHOOD DIVISION

An important milestone has been reached

The project continues to move forward after securing financial support from the government under the DETR program.

CRÈCHE



We have reached the end of the school year, and ten new children are about to start school. We wish them all the best! In June, we began orientation mornings at the Eymet preschool, where the children had the opportunity to explore the facilities, learn about the morning routine, and meet the teacher who will be welcoming them in September.

The placement committee met in late April to prepare for the start of the 2026–2027 school year and welcome the new children.

The daycare centre wrapped up its baby yoga workshops at the end of March. Then, in April, we continued with circus and percussion workshops led by the Troubadour association. The children were introduced to the circus arts using age-appropriate equipment, followed by a music and percussion session where they explored rhythms and different sounds.

The Bébés Arts Parents' Association funded a parent-child workshop that took place on 25th April. This gave parents the opportunity to observe how a workshop is conducted and to see their children's motor skills in action. The association also funded a massage workshop, held on 6th June, to teach families massage techniques for ensuring children remain calm.

In addition, since January, we have been continuing our intergenerational workshops at the Eymet retirement home, with one workshop per month. The program includes giant puzzles, bingo, and motor skill games designed to foster connections.

With the nice weather, we organised outings with the older children: a trip to the market, a visit to the Ranch du Saut-du-loup, and a picnic.

And to wrap up the school year, our annual party took place on 30th June: a musical performance with Etienne, a motor skills course, games, and lots of laughter!



PRIMARY SCHOOL

COMMUNITY OF COMMUNES PORTES SUD PERIGORD

A busy life at school!

A rewarding school year continues at the Chardonnerets campus for preschool students from the Toute Petite to the Grande Section classes, and at the Pont de Juillet site for students in grades CP to CM2. As part of their learning journey, here are a few examples of what marks each student's progress.

Fitness Trail

The school is involved with the USEP association, which promotes access to sports through various events bringing together schools in the area. For example, Olympic Day in March, held at the gym, during which students were able to participate in numerous workshops organised by local clubs (soccer, pétanque, rugby, handball) or by the physical education teachers (track and field). It is worth noting the exemplary behavior of the 160 students throughout this wonderful day.

The CM2 students participated in the middle school cross-country race, which also helps prepare them for their transition to sixth grade.

As it does every year, the "P'tit Tour" bike ride gives CM1 - CM2 the chance to go on a road trip, with this year's route taking them all the way to Singleyrac.

Swimming takes center stage throughout the month of June for students from kindergarten through CS to CM, thanks to the opening of the municipal pool.

Health Trail

In collaboration with the school nurse, workshops are held for both preschool and elementary school students to educate them on a variety of topics, ranging from personal hygiene to nutrition, from the dangers of sun exposure to basic first aid, as well as proper screen time habits.

Cultural Trail

Throughout the year, all classes participated in the "School & Cinema" program, with a lineup tailored to each grade level, in the superb setting of the Eden Cultural Centre.

After exploring aspects of local heritage at the start of the year, the students ventured a bit further afield toward the end of the year with field trips to the Moulin de la Rouzique, the Cave of the 100 Mammoths in Rouffignac, and the Saut du Loup Ranch in Miramont.

In the end, it's hard to sum up an entire school year... To bring the 2025–2026 school year to a lovely close, families gathered for the two performances of the end-of-year show on Friday 26th June at the Eden.



SOLIDARITY

Domestic Violence

Physical, sexual, psychological, verbal, material, and economic abuse, as well as cyber violence, threats, and shaming, are acts punishable by law. Everyone has rights, regardless of their personal situation.

Julie Cousinet and Yvonne Beraudo, rural equality liaisons, are available every other Thursday from 9 a.m. to 11 a.m. at the Mairie; their office is located on the 2nd floor. Their role is to listen to victims of violence and refer them to appropriate services, as well as to follow up on any legal proceedings initiated as a result of the violence.

International Women's Rights Day

Since 2021, the town of Eymet has been raising awareness of women's rights by organising "Women's Month." On 8th March, 2026, International Women's Rights Day was organised in collaboration with the Eymet en Fête association, the Eymet Mill competition, La Mauvaise Herbe bookshop, Femmes Solidaires, and several other participants.

As is customary, children were part of the adventure, as it is essential to raise awareness of the values of equality and respect from a very young age. This year, elementary school students from the Community of Communes participated in an art project led by Camille Lavaud, a comic book author. The artwork was created as part of the CLAS program, during which the children had the opportunity to reflect, discuss, and express themselves on the topic of women's rights.

These workshops enabled the children to acquire technical, graphic design, and staging skills. This resulted in a large poster measuring 2.40 m by 1.60 m, as well as a series of signs bearing their messages—symbols of women's rights—which were unveiled at the start of the day. The children's mural, titled "Claris Against the Shadows," is displayed on the Chateau keep, and the signs have been distributed to the various participating schools.



The day continued at the Eden with a program organised by the Eymet en Fête association: a book fair, a screening of short films followed by a panel discussion, readings, workshops, and singing, theatre, and dance performances and ended with music, bringing this day dedicated to women to a close with voices that were 100% female.

BRETOU SPORTS FIELD

Now that the football field and its lighting have been approved by the Dordogne district, the Football Club Olympique Eymétois returned to the site on the last weekend of March for its adult teams.



The soccer school resumed after the Easter break. The field is used every day of the week by the club's various age groups, although there are still a few minor improvements to be made, such as installing the scoreboard.

Work on the new building, however, has fallen behind schedule and will be completed before summer. In the meantime, the club is using the old locker rooms until the new ones are ready. Some additional work on the old locker rooms is planned, such as replacing the door frames. It's worth noting that the entire old locker room/grandstand complex has been repainted, giving it a nice face lift.

SWIMMING POOL

The pool has been open to schools since 1st June. A new heat pump was installed in May, allowing students to enjoy a water temperature of 27/28 degrees during their school swimming lessons in June and ensuring a stable water temperature throughout the season. Starting 3rd July, the pool will be open to the public every day from 2:00 p.m. to 7:00 p.m.

Prices: free for children under 5, €1.50 for ages 5–15, €2.30 for adults. Passes: 10 swims for €12 (ages 5–15), €18 (adults); 20 swims for €23 (ages 5–15), €35 (adults). Swimming lessons: 1 lesson = €12, 5 lessons = €60, 10 lessons = €120

Supporting local initiatives with practically, pragmatism and fairness.

The municipality reaffirms its commitment to the vitality of community organisations and cultural actors who actively contribute to Eymet's vitality.

Within a necessarily constrained budgetary context, the municipality's cultural policy is guided by a single principle: supporting initiatives, making the most of existing resources, and promoting controlled and planned development.

Every request for a grant, partnership, or support is therefore carefully reviewed.

The municipality also ensures that every association operating within its jurisdiction has the same rights and equal access to municipal facilities.

This commitment is reflected, in particular, by the free provision of municipal halls and the municipality's coverage of utility costs (electricity, heating, water).

Coverage of infrastructure costs and operating costs effectively constitute a significant form of subsidy provided by the local authority to support the local voluntary sector.

We are working to improve three key areas: the shared use of certain materials and equipment; enhanced coordination of schedules to promote synergy among cultural events; and increased support for communication efforts related to cultural and artistic activities.

A more open, busier, and livelier library

The decision to make registration at the municipal library completely free is paying off. Visitor numbers have increased significantly, confirming residents' attachment to this hub of culture and community life.

Beyond simply lending books, the library is now fully embracing its role as a local cultural hub, hosting gatherings, events, workshops throughout the year: board game nights with the LUDIKA association, introductory music sessions with Étienne Roux, literary events in partnership with the La Mauvaise Herbe bookstore, and writing workshops.



The municipality would like to acknowledge the dedicated work of the volunteers—Nicole, Brigitte, Fabienne, and Daniel—whose commitment remains indispensable.



The municipality would also like to remind residents that a library membership entitles them to reduced-price tickets for movie screenings held at the Eden. This is a way to encourage connections between reading, cinema, and access to culture.

This initiative is also part of the partnership developed with Ciné Passion, a key player in traveling cinema in the Dordogne, which allows local residents to enjoy a regular and diverse film lineup. During the summer, the cinema will also venture beyond its walls with seven outdoor screenings scheduled for 4th, 13th, 27th & 31st July, & 3rd, 10th, & 20th August. These summer events will combine a friendly atmosphere with cinematic discovery in the Cadix garden.

This synergy among cultural facilities contributes to a broader goal: making culture increasingly accessible to the residents of Eymet, while strengthening ties among the various local stakeholders.





Did you know?

Eymet is now one of the most dynamic and well-attended stops on the traveling film circuit organised by Ciné Passion. This particularly high turnout reflects not only the residents' love of cinema but also the quality of the collaborative work carried out by municipal teams and professionals from the network.

The municipality and Ciné Passion hope to foster the emergence of a community of film enthusiasts that brings together residents and volunteers to contribute ideas on programming and cultural events related to cinema, such as themed evenings and retrospectives.

The association L'Arrosoir, which notably runs the refreshment stands before and after screenings, actively contributes to the local cultural scene by providing financial support for the Eden's promotional efforts and, through this, its broader impact. New volunteers wishing to contribute to this initiative will be warmly welcomed.



The Micro-Folie : a cultural & digital opportunity

Hosted in Eymet until November before transferring to Issigeac, the Micro-Folie represents a particularly promising local tool.

This digital museum provides access to thousands of works from leading national and international cultural institutions, while opening up new possibilities for educational activities, lectures, workshops, outreach programs, and virtual reality experiences...

The municipality encourages local organizations and stakeholders to take full advantage of this resource in order to explore its full potential.

Each session must be supervised by trained staff. The designated elected officials have also been trained in its use and are available to assist you.



Events to Help Shape Eymet's Cultural Life Together

Among the upcoming highlights is the Assises de la Culture, scheduled for Sunday 13th September at the Eden.

This event will bring together associations, volunteers, institutions, partners, artists, entrepreneurs, and residents

with a shared goal: to collectively reflect on the region's cultural direction for the coming years.

Starting in September, a choir for teenagers will also be launched under the direction of Matt Evans. Auditions are scheduled for 9th September.

A community-focused, high-quality, and accessible cultural policy

The municipality's cultural program is structured around three major priorities: promoting and supporting existing initiatives in the area; encouraging cultural innovation through partnerships and resource-sharing; and diversifying artistic offerings, particularly in the fields of visual and plastic arts, as well as participatory practices.

With this in mind, the castle project is part of a comprehensive approach that combines heritage, artistic creation, and cultural development. The goal is to envision a multifaceted space capable of hosting hybrid projects that blend local history, artistic and musical residencies, exhibitions, and community initiatives.

These perspectives outline an ambition to firmly establish culture at the heart of the regional development plan, by linking heritage, creativity, and daily life, with a focus on dynamism, openness, and transmission.

ADEMIR : Digital technology for all, and now making things within everyone's reach

The ADEMIR Association which is well established in Eymet, has been helping local residents for several years to become digitally literate – a skill that has become essential in everyday life. Nowadays, most administrative procedures are carried out online: filing declarations, applying for benefits, renewing documents, booking appointments, tracking applications, and communicating with public or social services. For many people, these procedures can seem complex, especially if they are not very familiar with their computer or mobile phone. The workshops offered by ADEMIR are designed to help people learn how to navigate official websites, create and manage a personal account, send documents, use France Connect and recognise trustworthy websites. This digital independence has become essential for reducing reliance on others and building confidence in carrying out everyday tasks.



At the same time, the association is developing new activities centred on digital manufacturing.

The arrival of a laser engraver, followed by a 3D printer,

opens up unprecedented opportunities for members. Thanks to this equipment everyone can discover how to design an object on a computer, modify it to suit their needs, and then produce it.

The creative process often begins with a digital drawing: a part is modelled on

a simple piece of software, adjusted, then sent to the machine that engraves or prints it. This approach provides a practical insight into how the objects around us are created. Several creations have already been produced, such as a smartphone stand, and other projects are in the pipeline. These tools make it possible to produce bespoke parts, to replace a broken component rather than throwing it away, or even to bring personal ideas to life. ADEMIR also continues to raise awareness amongst local residents about the risks associated with the internet. Knowing how to recognise fake news, avoid scams, spot a fraudulent message or protect one's personal data has become essential. Workshops dedicated to these topics equip participants with the right habits to use their devices safely.

The association also remains a place for socialising. Every year, an outing is organised, as well as a communal meal at the end of the year where everyone brings a dish to share. These occasions strengthen the bonds between members and contribute to the warm atmosphere that characterises ADEMIR. Open to all, the association continues its mission: to help the residents of Eymet become self-reliant in an ever changing digital world, whilst offering them the opportunity to discover innovative technologies and take part in social events.

ASSOCIATION GRANTS

The allocation of grants to associations was approved at the municipal council meeting on 20th April. Totalling €27,150, the allocation breaks down as follows: for 7 sports organisations: €9,500 (€3,300 in 2025); for 13 cultural organisations: €9,050 (€10,910 in 2025); for 7 social organisations: €4,700 (€6,200 in 2025), and for 6 associations involved in community and commercial initiatives: €3,900 (€3,600 in 2025).

Our group began its term by discussing each member's specific interests in order to better define the role of each elected official. Our mayor has delegated responsibilities to six deputy mayors with expertise in city management, community relations and commercial activities, quality of life, public works, sustainable development, infrastructure management, early childhood, youth, and social services, as well as sports and cultural affairs.

Eleven council members have been delegated specific responsibilities to assist the deputy mayors in their duties.

Two council members have not been delegated responsibilities for municipal management; as they serve as vice-presidents for education and the economy in the inter-municipal community, they received their delegations from the president of that community.

Committees are tasked with reviewing projects before submitting them to the city council for approval.

The chosen organisational structure and the scope of the delegated responsibilities enable a highly collaborative approach and ensure optimal participation by our entire group in the development of projects, their presentation, and the monitoring of their implementation.

The 2026 budget marks the first major milestone at the start of this term. It is in line with our commitments: no tax increases, rigorous and careful management of expenditures, and a debt ratio below the average.

Among our projects, the Bretou Plain, the creation of the early childhood centre, and the restoration of the Chateau represent three major investments. These projects are currently under review and will enable us to seek out the best possible grants. The budget allocations and our self-financing capabilities provide us with a loan guarantee for the implementation of the planned projects.

"For you, with you" is not just a run-of-the-mill campaign slogan but the very essence of our commitment.

"For you" reflects our determination to fully meet the wishes of our residents. We want to build an ever more dynamic and active future so that our entire population remains proud of Eymet.

"With you" expresses our determination to further enhance the participation of Eymet's residents in community life; this is a complex undertaking; however, with the council member delegated to this task, our group is determined to make progress on this issue that is so important to us.

All the activities offered by the various associations and the municipality contribute to the reputation of the town of Eymet. During this summer season, numerous festivities will take place one after another; we hope you enjoy them to the fullest.

A WORD FROM THE 'EYMET ADVANCES WITH YOU' GROUP

Le mot du groupe 'Eymet avance avec vous'

In the last municipal elections, the residents of Eymet elected three members from our group to the Municipal Council. With 26% of the vote, this result is a clear mandate for us. We aim to serve as a useful, constructive opposition that is attentive to the public interest. Being in the opposition does not mean opposing everything systematically. Our role is to exercise active vigilance, put forward concrete proposals, and defend the public interest. Many residents of Eymet today express a sense that they lack information and are not involved in decisions that directly affect them. This situation calls for a response.

We will advocate for a more open local democracy, based on transparency, dialogue, and citizen participation. Restoring residents' rightful place in public life is, in our view, an essential priority. We believe, for example, that a committee or delegation dedicated to agriculture would be entirely appropriate, given the importance of this sector to our community. More broadly, we regret that our group was not more closely involved in the organisation of the delegations. If their purpose is to foster discussion on specific topics, it seemed appropriate to us that all viewpoints represented on the council be included.

Pluralism is not an obstacle: it is an essential asset that enriches the quality of public debate. That has not been the case. Yet our elected officials possess recognised expertise that is essential and useful to community life: urban planning, construction management, agriculture, tourism, and municipal administrative and financial management.

Regarding the 2026 budget, its significant increase (+116%) reflects a high level of investment, partly due to projects that have been deferred in recent years. We have raised the legitimate question of future maintenance and operating costs that have not been factored in. Investment funds are being allocated to projects with no guarantee of success. The decision to repay loans from previous years in a single year raises concerns. It amounts to a significant reduction in the municipality's safety reserves. For a community of 2,500 residents with limited financial flexibility, this issue deserved a debate. Finally, regarding the community of municipalities, our representative, Gilles Bergougnoux, is awaiting the establishment of the working groups in which he will participate (Tourism and Economy), which will allow him to fully engage in discussions and decision-making. We remain convinced that constructive dialogue, based on listening and respecting different perspectives, is the best way to meet residents' expectations. We will continue to contribute to this effort with dedication, in a spirit of openness and responsibility.
